How can YOU help? - here are some of the things volunteers do to make May 7th Tag Sale Day a success for everyone:



1. Solicit Sponsor Ads for Map
2. Publicity - sign-ups, donations of goods, etc.

Society Happenings

At the **Society's Annual Meeting** in January **William J. Van Beynum awards** were presented to: Pat Crowther, Eleanor Crowther, Doris Sherrow-Heidenis, Professor Indira Karamcheti and Regina Woltmann. **Service awards** went to Vivian Dower and Susanne Anderson. The recipients of the Van Beynum and service awards are *recognized for their volunteer work to preserve Portland's history*.

Eleanor Crowther served as Vice-President and President and was instrumental in guiding the Society through the acquisition of the Ruth Callander House. For fourteen years she has chaired the Annual Town-Wide Tag Sale. She has served on many committees, including chairing the Ways and Means committee and the Callander House committee.

Pat Crowther has served on the Finance Board since it was established in 1993. He has worked on and overseen many projects required to open and maintain the museum; everything from painting to plumbing. He has been our setup and cleanup man for all fourteen Annual Town-Wide Tag Sales.

Doris Sherrow-Heidenis has spent many years researching and writing about Portland's history. She collaborated with others on *The History and Architecture of Portland*, a book that serves as a primary resource on the town's history and buildings. Doris has presented programs for the Society, worked with acquisitions in the Museum, and has collaborated on the research and writing for our annual calendars. She willingly assists genealogists and others researching Portland's early settlers. Recently, Doris began serving on the Collections Board.

Indira Karamcheti is a professor at Wesleyan University. In fall 2009, she developed and taught a course entitled "Oral Histories and the Portland Brownstone Quarry." Her students interviewed individuals familiar with various aspects of the brownstone quarries, and presented to the Society the oral narratives they produced.

Regina Woltmann, a 25+ year member, has served as Recording Secretary, President and Director. Regina has been long time chair of the Program committee and is a Trustee. In addition to her work on many committees, she has helped with many events, and was key in the development of the Military Exhibit and Wedding Dress Exhibit.

Vivian Dower is a Charter member who has served the Society in many capacities especially collecting acquisitions and creating exhibits. She has always been available when volunteers were needed. Her true love for clothes and costumes makes her invaluable when it comes to dressing the mannequins. Most recently, Vivian served as a Trustee.

Susanne Anderson was a Director, Vice-President, President, and served as Ways and Means chair. Sue has been instrumental in raising money through events: the House

Tour, the Victorian Tea, and the Secret Garden Tour; and by creating many products: a Children's Coloring Book, a cookbook, magnets with historic scenes, and 2010's holiday ornaments. She created the Farms Exhibit and is working to complete a book based on the material.

Officers and Board members for 2011 were elected. The new board members are: President Deb Ellsworth; First Vice President Claire Frisbie; Second Vice President Martha Lutecki; Recording Secretary Linda Cunningham; Corresponding Secretary Luiza McDougall; Treasurer Jim McCabe; Directors Gene Sullivan, George Gilbert and Ruth Freeburg.

In other news, following the Society's Bylaws update, the **Trustees Board** was formed last year with *Vivan Dower, Phyllis Frisbie, Robert McDougall, Christine Sullivan and Regina Woltmann* serving. They have been meeting monthly working on long range planning for the Society. To date a significant visioning process has taken place which will form the basis for goal setting and action items.

Recently the new **Collections Board** was seated. Members are *Rick Gildersleeve, Doris Sherrow-Heidenis and Susan Young*. Their first task is to research and draft a Collections Policy for the Society. After approval, this policy will be the basis for future action of the Board.

Ruth Callander House Museum of Portland History

The sesquicentennial remembrance of the beginning of the **Civil War** is celebrated with an exhibit of items from the collection and loans. The exhibit includes a number of pieces the Union soldier carried, including the over-cape, supply bag, bullet case, powder horn and rifle. Photographs and letters of Civil War soldiers who were ancestors of Portland residents are also shown.

In another area, a selection of **quilts from the Society's collection** is displayed along with a traditional rope bed. Quilts in a number of varied yet traditional patterns are included, dating from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In addition, the *Album Quilt of the Gildersleeve Family* from the mid 19th century is displayed. This quilt contains signature blocks of family members and friends of the era.

The **Gildersleeves** are further represented with a number of items from their various businesses. Tools and ships of S. Gildersleeve & Sons Shipyard; a day ledger and container from the business and store; and the family settee of Sylvester Gildersleeve are displayed.

The Exhibits Committee continues to *welcome materials of the Civil War Era* for the ongoing exhibit. Items may be donated or loaned, and scans can be done of photographs. Please contact Deb Ellsworth at 860-342-1927 or Claire Frisbie at 860-335-8581.
