Planning for the Future...

The Portland Historical Society was organized in 1973, by a group of individuals who shared an interest in the history of the town. Next year the Society will celebrate 40 years since its incorporation. During our first four decades our organization has evolved from a social group offering monthly program meetings, to a local institution which is actively working to collect, preserve and share information and material about Portland.

With the help of many dedicated volunteers and generous supporters, we have an impressive list of achievements that include: placing bronze markers at Historic Sites around town; a program to place date plaques on historic homes; monthly program meetings; the Annual Town-Wide Tag Sale since 1997; a Museum Room at the Portland Library until 2003; the Ruth Callander House Museum of Portland History since 2003, where our monthly openings have featured several exhibit changes a year; Precious Pieces of Portland, an annual art contest for local third graders studying Portland History; House Tours; the Year round 10km Volksmarch; Secret Garden Tour; Historic Fashion Show and Teas; the Callander Cupboard, offering books and gift items related to the town's history; and a regular newsletter.

As the Society has grown, our organization has adjusted to face the challenges of our expanded scope.

In 2008, we adopted bylaw revisions intended to prepare the Society for continued growth.

A Collections Board was established to help define policies and procedures for managing our growing collection of artifacts and information; and a Board of Trustees was established to provide long term strategic planning for the Society. At the recommendation of the Trustees, the leadership of the Society has recently participated in two planning workshops with the guidance of John Monroe, an organizational consultant well known in town for his work with the Brownstone Quorum. These workshops resulted in a set of goals and stimulating ideas that the Trustees will be shaping into a five-year plan. This will be presented to the Executive Board and Membership this spring, as we prepare for the Society's 40th Anniversary in 2013 and the town's 175th Anniversary in 2016. *We are eager to get started and look forward to sharing our plans with you.
