Pelton-Kelsey-Strickland Album Quilt

On June 14, 2014, the descendants of **Louisa Lydia Strickland Pelton** will present a friends album quilt to the Portland Historical Society during a reception and talk on the family history at 1 PM. This special presentation will take place during the Connecticut Open House Day at the Ruth Callander House Museum of Portland History located at 492 Main St, Portland, CT, open from 11 AM to 3 PM. Favorite family desserts will be served for refreshments.

The **Pelton-Kelsey-Strickland Album Quilt** is a quilt top made in 1847 by **Louisa Lydia Strickland Pelton** who was a Portland resident throughout her life. The quilt top was

turned into a quilt by **Bethia Kelsey Robinson Washburn**, the great-great-granddaughter of Louisa. In making the quilt, Bethia used fabric woven by her great-grandmother, the daughter of Louisa, **Frances Maria Pelton**, which makes the quilt truly intergenerational. The top was signed by many family and friends in 1847 which is why it is called an "album quilt". (Continued on page 3)

The museum will be open Saturday from 11 AM with a number of exhibits on display. The museum's present exhibit, 40 Years of Collecting Portland's History, commemorates the Portland Historical Society's 40th anniversary and features a variety of items from the Society's large collection. Included are a Portland baseball uniform donated by J. William Foley and a one-piece bathing suit circa 1920's donated by Mary Mintzer. The prize-winning model of the Arrigoni Bridge, constructed by Portland resident Joe Virgadula, is included in the River Crossings exhibit. In addition, Portland history exhibits show many items from quarrying, shipbuilding, tobacco farming, and Native American artifacts.

Pelton-Kelsey Quilt History - Bethia Washburn

Editor: Bethia created a comprehensive hand-written book with memories and photos to accompany the quilt. She created 21 copies of this book so that each descendent family could have a copy! The following is an excerpt.

One day I went down to see the Folks who lived in the "Lower Place" - Aunt Grace, Uncle Will and Louisa Hall. It was like going to a Living Museum, but being a teenager in the late 40's I didn't appreciate it.

Aunt Grace went upstairs and presently came down with a bag saying that this was something her Grandmother had made (Louisa Pelton) and she wanted me to have it!

I brought it home and found it to be a 100 year old quilt top. I had no idea what I had and put it in a small trunk with my other treasures. That trunk traveled with me to Michigan, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and back to Massachusetts, where in the early 1980's, I decided it was time to make it into a real quilt as I had the space and a quilting frame. I took it to several shows in Seattle and Connecticut and it was admired by all... Since it is an album quilt, Louisa had her friends and neighbors join in the effort and contribute squares with an autograph on each. Since I needed a fabric with which to bind the edges my Grandmother contributed a piece of linen ...most likely woven by Frances Maria Kelsey.
